Disclosure & Disqualification Requirements

Any person or group of persons acting in concert who directly or indirectly contribute \$1,000 or more in support of or in opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Calaveras LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974 applicable to local initiative measures to be submitted to the electorate. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals; they may be reviewed at Government Code §§56700.1 and 81000 et sea. Additional information about the requirements pertaining to local initiative measures to be presented to the electorate can be obtained by calling the Fair Political Practices Commission at (916) 322-5660. A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or an interested party. The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

Calaveras Local Agency Formation Commission Meeting Minutes – Monday, May 16, 2022

1. Call to Order/Roll Call – Order was called by Chair Callaway at 6:06 p.m. on Monday, May 16, 2022.

2. Election of Chair and Vice-Chair

a. Election of Chair – Must be a Public Member
 Chair Callaway commented that these positions are always chosen at the last meeting of a fiscal year, which is this meeting.

As Commissioner Paque is the only Public Member, Chair Callaway confirmed that she is the new Chair.

Election of Vice-Chair – Must be a Special District Member
 MOTION by Chair Callaway as a white paper nomination for Commissioner
 Smith to become Vice-Chair. Motion passed 5 yes, 0 no, 2 absent.

Commissioner Paque took over as Chair of the meeting.

3. Public Comment:

There was no public comment.

4. Consider Minutes of March 21, 2022, LAFCo meeting:

MOTION by Commissioner Smith to approve the minutes of the March 21, 2022, LAFCo meeting as presented, second by Commissioner Callaway. Motion passed 5 yes, 0 no, 2 absent.

5. Consent Agenda:

- a. Review and authorize claims for March and April 2022.

MOTION by Commissioner Smith to approve the Consent Agenda and Claims for March and April 2022 as presented, and Resolution 2022-0006 authorizing teleconference for the May 16, 2022, meeting, second by Commissioner Herndon. Motion passed 5 yes, 0 no, 2 absent.

6. Correspondence:

There was no correspondence.

Public Hearings:

- 7. Public Hearing Regarding the Service Review (MSR) for Road Community Services Districts in Calaveras County including Appaloosa Road (ARCSD), Circle XX (CXXCSD), Copper Cove Rocky Road (CCRRCSD), Lynn Park Acres (LPACSD), Middle River (MRCSD), Mountain Ranch Subdivision (MRSCSD), Three Cent Flat (TCFCSD), and Wallace (WCSD):
 - a. Receive Executive Officer's report.
 Executive Officer Benoit explained that the Commission had decided to form a committee comprising Commissioners Tofanelli, Paque and Copeland to meet with the districts to provide them training on required filings, budget matters, websites, the Brown Act, etc. At this LAFCo meeting, the Commission can approve the MSR with findings on which this committee will work with the districts to help them resolve their issues. LAFCo will also be helping the districts form a Special Districts Association so they can assist one another, much as the Fire Districts Association does for the fire districts. The next step in the process will be to define Spheres of Influence for each district, most of which were formed from subdivisions. The MSR can be update as needed at that time.
 - b. Conduct Hearing and consider Resolution 2022-0005 adopting a Service Review of Road Services for Road Community/Services Districts.
 Commissioner Callaway asked what the advantages would be in turning the CSDs into CSAs. Executive Officer Benoit responded that it would mean less work for the districts, but would cost the county money, and voters do not like approving tax increases. In addition, some districts want to remain districts because it means local control of their roads.

Commissioner Herndon asked if there is an item coming up on the Board of Supervisors' agenda regarding CSAs. Commissioner Folendorf replied that there is. Commissioner Herndon then stated that she believed a lot of the public does not understand the various types of governance that exist for handling roads, e.g., CSDs, CSAs, road maintenance agreements, etc.

Commissioner Folendorf commented that she believed one of the topics the Board will be discussing is CSAs versus CSDs. Commissioner Callaway added that people do get confused as to which taxes pay for what things, so public education is needed.

Commissioner Smith commented that, in his experience in planning, 90 percent of the groups who come to the county requesting to become CSAs are denied because it does not make economic sense for small areas. He added that some non-functioning districts should be dissolved and become private, although that creates fee payment enforcement issues. Chair Paque added that one of the things the LAFCo committee will do when they meet with the districts is to explain the various governance options to them, and that the functionality of these districts can be re-examined in a year.

Jim Lamb, Treasurer of Mountain Ranch Subdivision CSD, spoke from the audience, stating that their district is trying to catch up. One of the problems they have, however, is that one of their roads has become more of a public thoroughfare than a private subdivision road, and that a new planned subdivision on this road will make it even busier. He wanted to know to whom they could talk with at the county concerning this issue. He added that another problem in their district was damage done to some of their roads by PG&E during the Butte Fire, for which PG&E has not compensated them. Commissioner Callaway asked Mr. Lamb if MRSCSD wanted to make comments on the proposed MSR, and Mr. Lamb said they would. Chair Paque explained that Mr. Lamb could write a response to the MSR as a member of the public, or the CSD board could write a response. She then asked Executive Officer Benoit if MRSCSD could be excluded from the MSR if the Commission voted on approving the MSR. Mr. Benoit responded that the Commission could postpone approval of the MSR to give MRSCSD time to respond. He added that he would like to learn more about the new subdivision Mr. Lamb had mentioned.

MOTION by Commissioner Smith to postpone consideration and approval of Resolution 2022-0005 adopting a Municipal Service Review for Road Community Service Districts to the July 18, 2022, LAFCo Commission meeting, second by Commissioner Folendorf. Motion passed 5 yes, 0 no, 2 absent.

8. Conduct Public Hearing Regarding the Final 2022-2023 LAFCo Budget:

a. Receive Executive Officer's report and consider Resolution 2022-007 adopting a proposed 2022-2023 LAFCo Budget.
Executive Officer Benoit explained that the only change from the proposed budget presented at the March LAFCo meeting involved liability insurance.
At the time of the March meeting, SDRMA had sent out a proposed increase in insurance cost, but since then they sent out a final letter stating the

increase would not be as great as previously quoted. Therefore, the total budget amount has decreased slightly.

Commissioner Callaway proposed that the mileage reimbursement be increased to \$2,000 due to recent increases in driving costs.

Chair Paque then asked if the proposed pay increase in agenda item b was included in the current budget total for Professional Services. Mr. Benoit stated that it was not, but that item b could be handled by increasing the budgeted amount from \$45,000 to \$47,000. At this point the Commission decided to consider item b, then come back to this item.

After approving item b, the Commission returned to consideration of item a. Commissioner Smith asked if Commissioners were allowed to be reimbursed for their mileage in attending LAFCo Commission meetings. Mr. Benoit replied that Commissioners used to receive mileage, but that at some point, the stipend had been increased to cover mileage, and that if the Commissioners wanted to account for increased travel costs, they could again increase their stipend. Chair Paque added that Commissioners do get mileage when driving to LAFCo conferences. She then said consideration of the Commissioner's stipends was not on this agenda. Mr. Benoit said the Commission could increase the amount of total Commissioners Stipend in the budget now, however.

MOTION by Commissioner Callaway to approve the LAFCo budget for 2022-2023 with an increase in proposed mileage reimbursement from \$1,000 to \$2,000, and with an increase in proposed Commissioners Stipend from \$3,300 to \$6,600, second by Commissioner Folendorf. Motion passed 6 yes, 0 no, 1 absent.

b. Consider a 6.4% increase in compensation for LAFCo Clerk and Executive Officer and approve Amendment #2 to the Agreement for Executive Officer Services.

MOTION by Commissioner Smith to approve a 6.4% increase in compensation for the LAFCo Clerk and Executive Officer and approve Amendment #2 to the Agreement for Executive Officer Services as presented, second by Commissioner Callaway. Motion passed 6 yes, 0 no, 1 absent.

9. Discussion of Mobile Workshop Options in Calaveras County for the CALAFCO Annual Staff Workshop in Murphy's on April 26th Through April 28th, 2023: Executive Officer Benoit stated that he is working with the new CALAFCO Executive Director to plan the Annual Staff Workshop for 2023, which will be in Calaveras County. He requested ideas from the Commission on a mobile workshop that would showcase Calaveras County. Commissioner Foledorf suggested a workshop on the fuel reduction

being done along Highway 4.

Commissioner Callaway suggested having a frog jumping contest and a tour of the Angels Camp Frog Museum. Chair Paque mentioned that there is a distillery in the county. Mr. Benoit said these would be good "fun" events rather than the mobile workshop.

Commissioner Herndon suggested a party boat on the New Melones Reservoir, tying in with the economic impact of reservoirs and their effect on the water supply.

10. Executive Officer's Report:

a. Special District Alternate Recruitment – Due May 20th.

Executive Officer Benoit reported that he has received one application so far and the deadline is Friday, May 20.

Mr. Benoit also reported that SB 938 is moving through the legislature. Chair Paque added that Hertzberg is working on getting this bill through.

11. Commissioner Reports:

Commissioner Moncada reported that she is hosting the Miss Calaveras contest for the fair this year, and invited everyone to attend. It is on Thursday at 8 p.m. Chair Paque stated that the fair starts on Thursday with Locals Day.

12. Adjournment

Meeting was adjourned at 7:14 p.m. The next regular meeting will be Monday, July 18, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in San Andreas.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2022-0008

A RESOLUTION OF THE CALAVERAS LAFCO OF THE AUTHORIZING A REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETING OF THE COMMISSION PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953(e)

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953(e), as amended by Assembly Bill No. 361, allows legislative bodies to hold open meetings by teleconference without reference to otherwise applicable requirements in Government Code section 54953(b)(3), so long as the legislative body complies with certain requirements, there exists a declared state of emergency, and one of the following circumstances is met:

- 1. State or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.
- 2. The legislative body is holding the meeting for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.
- 3. The legislative body has determined, by majority vote, pursuant to option 2, that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

WHEREAS, the Governor of California proclaimed a state of emergency pursuant to Government Code section 8625 on March 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the CALAVERAS LAFCO desires to hold its public meetings by teleconference consistent with Government Code section 54953(e).

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CALAVERAS LAFCO DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Conditions are met</u>. The CALAVERAS LAFCO hereby finds and declares the following, as required by Government Code section 54953(e)(3):

- 1. The Governor of California proclaimed a state of emergency on March 4, 2020, pursuant to Government Code section 8625, which remains in effect.
- 2. The reasons for adopting this resolution are one or more of the following:
 - a. State or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.
 - b. The legislative body is holding the meeting for the purpose of determining whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 56425 requires that the Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") adopt and periodically review Sphere of Influence Plans for all agencies in its jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 56430 requires that LAFCO conduct a review of the municipal services provided by and within an agency prior to updating or adopting its Sphere of Influence Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the Sphere of Influence Plan is the primary planning tool for LAFCO and defines the probable physical boundaries and service area of a local agency as determined by LAFCO; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission adopted guidelines for conducting Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) included in its Policies, Standards and Procedures adopted on August 17, 2009, which applies to this MSR for water services provided by the Appaloosa Road (ARCSD), Circle XX (CXXCSD), Copper Cove Rocky Road (CCRRCSD), Lynn Park Acres (LPACSD), Middle River (MRCSD), Mountain Ranch Subdivision (MRSCSD), Three Cent Flat (TCFCSD), and Wallace (WCSD); and,

WHEREAS, at the time and in the manner provided by law, the Executive Officer gave notice of the date, time, and place of a public hearing by the Commission for the MSR, including approval of the report and adoption of the written determinations contained therein; and.

WHEREAS, the Commission hereby determines that the Service Review for road services provided by the Appaloosa Road (ARCSD), Circle XX (CXXCSD), Copper Cove Rocky Road (CCRRCSD), Lynn Park Acres (LPACSD), Middle River (MRCSD), Mountain Ranch Subdivision (MRSCSD), Three Cent Flat (TCFCSD), and Wallace (WCSD).and written determinations contained therein will provide information for updating the Sphere of Influence for the District, and is otherwise consistent with the purposes and responsibility of the Commission for planning the logical and orderly development and coordination of local governmental agencies so as to advantageously provide for the present and future needs of the county and its communities; and,

WHEREAS, in its review of the Road Community Services Districts (CSD's) the Commission realizes they need technical assistance and are willing to support a Calaveras CSD Association whereby the Commission will assist the CSD's to the extent feasible.

WHEREAS, the Commission has heard all interested parties desiring to be heard and has considered the report by the Executive Officer and all other relevant evidence and information presented at said hearing; NOW, THEREFORE, the Calaveras Local Agency Formation Commission hereby resolves, orders and determines the following:

- The Municipal Service Review for services provided by the Appaloosa Road (ARCSD), Circle XX (CXXCSD), Copper Cove Rocky Road (CCRRCSD), Lynn Park Acres (LPACSD), Middle River (MRCSD), Mountain Ranch Subdivision (MRSCSD), Three Cent Flat (TCFCSD), and Wallace (WCSD), attached hereto as Exhibit A, is approved and the written determinations presented in the Municipal Service Review report are hereby adopted.
- 2. The Commission desires to work with the CSD's and facilitate in forming an association of Road CSDs to assist and facilitate in sharing and providing services with one another. For example, establishing a CSD association and providing miscellaneous assistance in addressing deficiencies, like helping with bids and local government requirements such as websites, memberships in regional or state organizations, statements of facts, Brown Act requirements and miscellaneous record keeping.
- LAFCO staff is further ordered to forward copies of this resolution containing the adopted Municipal Service Review to the Appaloosa Road (ARCSD), Circle XX (CXXCSD), Copper Cove Rocky Road (CCRRCSD), Lynn Park Acres (LPACSD), Middle River (MRCSD), Mountain Ranch Subdivision (MRSCSD), Three Cent Flat (TCFCSD), and Wallace (WCSD).
- 4. Directs staff to commence work on a Sphere of Influence Update for the Road Maintenance districts (Road CSD's) in Calaveras County.

WHEREAS, this Commission held a meeting and determined the meeting stipend for Commission members and alternates should be increased.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Calaveras Local Agency Formation Commission DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER as follows:

- 1. Meeting stipends for Commissioners and Alternates **shall be** increased from \$50.00 to \$100.00 per meeting commencing with the beginning of the 2022-2023 fiscal year.
- 2. Commissioner meeting stipends include travel costs incurred for attendance at any meeting of the Commission.
